Homework, Tests, Grading

Homework: I will be checking that every homework assignment is complete. Homework is due the next day. Please check *GOOGLE CLASSROOM or Agenda M-Th.*

Tests: In 3rd grade, we have tests in most subjects. If your child is completing the daily homework, it will help him/her do better on tests.

Report Card: 4, 3, 2, 1 scores are used instead of letter grades. 4, 3 = on level 2, 1 = below grade level



Home Learning Environment

- *Distraction free (no tv, music, or video games on)
- *Quiet location if possible *Table top is best for daily work. *No food or drinks near chromebook. *Paper, pencils, 3rd grade supplies nearby *Charge chromebook <u>every</u> evening *Please check your child's work, assisting as needed.

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Clever Log in

Our school district uses Clever to house most of the learning links for our kids. We use them during school, and will sometimes access them for homework. Accelerated Reader (AR)

*Every student has an AR Goal for the quarter, which was sent home a few weeks ago.

*I have hundreds of leveled books for kids to use at school. They will also be checking out library books. *The kids may quiz after reading a book in their level. *They are given class time every day to read/quiz. *85% or higher is goal for comprehension. *End of Quarter 1 is Oct. 13th.

Chromebook Care Reminders

*Please, no food/drinks are allowed near chromebook. *Clean hands before/after using chromebook at home. *Stickers are not permitted.

*Please do not pull bar code off.

*Cases are required. Chargers stay at home until end of year. *Insurance is recommended: Only \$35 for year. Replacing chromebook without insurance is \$315, so insurance is best. You must enroll within 30 days of school...Sept. 30th is final day. *Report damage immediately to me/office.

Assessments: Classroom/District/State

Classroom: Math tests, fact fluency tests, writing samples, reading fluency, informal observations, and other curricular areas.

District Assessments: We take them throughout the year. They are used for Diagnostic purposes, so that I can adjust my instruction to meet their needs. Example: STAR Test, Achieve 3000, iReady, District Benchmark tests.

State Testing: Taken in Spring (April) for all students in grades 3-6. The best way to prepare is by showing up to school daily (unless ill), and doing the classwork and homework to the best of your ability.



Tips for Success

*8-10 hours of sleep per night is crucial for learning to "stick."

*Attendance matters! Tardies impact learning, as well as learning of classmates. Please avoid appointments during the school day, and avoid checking your child out early.

*Check that your child is charging the chromebook every evening, and packing it in backpack for school each morning.

*Unless emergency, avoid office drop offs for items.
